Policy Title: Garbage Dumping

**Policy Objective:**

To provide for the response to reports of garbage dumping.

**Policy:**

Persons wishing to report illegal garbage dumping should call the Corman Park Police directly at (306) 242-8808.

When Public Works receives a report of garbage dumped on municipal lands the Municipality shall notify the Corman Park Police.

The Corman Park Police shall investigate the site to determine if there is any personal identifying information amongst the rubbish and, if so, whether a conviction shall be pursued.

Upon completion of their investigation the Corman Park Police shall notify Public Works and specify whether a conviction shall be pursued.

After receiving notice from the Corman Park Police Public Works staff shall be dispatched to clean-up the dumping site. In the event that the police are able to pursue a conviction Public Works staff shall prepare an invoice for clean-up to be submitted to the courts for restitution in the event of a conviction.

If the dumping site clean-up takes 3.5 hours or less Public Works staff is not required to document actual time spent on clean-up and an invoice shall be submitted for the minimum clean-up charge of \$475.62.

For dumping site clean-up that takes longer than 3.5 hours Public Works staff is required to document actual time spent on clean-up and the invoice shall be calculated using the following hourly rates for each hour and portion thereof:

- Labour cost for two employees at \$23.84 (Current Union Rate for Group 4 operators)
- Equipment cost for a 10 yd Tandem Truck at \$88.21 (Current Roadbuilder Rate)

The Municipality shall not be responsible for the clean-up of dumping sites located on private property.
