# Hockey players compete for roster spots at fall camp

The inaugural Warman U18 AAA Wildcats team hosted its first ever fall camp from August 28 to 30, with the season right around the corner.

The Wildcats already have a lot of players committed to the team and the roster is almost full, but there were still some spots available.

Only 50 hockey players were invited to the camp due to COVID-19 restrictions.

Usually at a camp like this there are more players who attend, but all fall camps and tryouts for minor hockey teams throughout the province have to adhere to the 50 player limit.

Even though this is a Warman club, players throughout the province attended the camp hoping to get a spot on the team.

Some of the players already committed to the team are not from the Warman area but the team does have local players on it.

Players were divided into four teams for the duration of the camp.

The first day (Friday) just consisted of a practice session for the players, as the red and white teams practiced together while the blue and green teams ran through drills together.

The second day (Saturday) of the camp, consisted

of scrimmages between the teams, along with a goalie session.

The scrimmages were a great way for the players to show off their skills and prove to the Wildcat coaches that they deserved a spot on the team.

Each team played three scrimmage games, so the coaches had lots of chances to evaluate the players and see what they could potentially bring to the team.

The goalie session was also a great opportunity for the respective netminders to display their talent as they had players shooting on net.

After the second day, the team made some cuts and brought back the remaining players for the third and final day of the camp.

This camp was the first chance for the organization to get a look at all of their committed players under one roof because the spring camp was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

It was a competitive camp as there were only have few spots open to make the team.

Overall, the camp went well and the organization is excited for the start of the season.

The official start of the 18U AAA season is still unknown but the team can still practice so it can be prepared and ready to go once the season starts.

## Rural Municipality of Corman Park

Public notice is hereby given that the Council of the Rural Municipality of Corman Park No. 344 intends to adopt a bylaw under The Planning and Development Act, 2007 to amend Bylaw No. 09/94, known as the R.M. of Corman Park Zoning Bylaw.

### INTENT

- a) Proposed Bylaw No. 44/20 will rezone from Agricultural District (AG) to Agricultural Residential 1 District (AR1) the lands described below. Proposed Bylaw No. 44/20 will allow for residential development to be permitted on a pre-existing property.
- b) Proposed Bylaw No. 46/20 will rezone from Agricultural Residential 1 District (AR1) to Commercial District (C) by contract the lands described below. Proposed Bylaw No. 46/20 includes a contract zoning agreement which will limit the use of the lands for the establishment of a Commercial Storage Centre.
- c) Proposed Bylaw No. 47/20 will rezone from Agricultural District (AG) to Agricultural Residential 1 District (AR1) the lands described below. Proposed Bylaw No. 47/20 will allow for the consolidation of two (2) existing residential parcels into the agricultural remnant and provide for the creation of one (1) new agricultural residential parcel.
- d) Proposed Bylaw 48/20 will provide for textual amendments that will add definitions and requirements for Bare Land Condominium developments as well as revise the use definitions for Commercial and Industrial Complexes and add development standards for said uses.

### AFFECTED LANDS

The affected lands are all that portion of:

- a) SE 1-35-6-W3 shown shaded on Map 1 (Bylaw 44/20).
- b) NE 24-35-5-W3 shown shaded on Map 2 (Bylaw 46/20).
- c) NW 17-35-4-W3 shown shaded on Map 3 (Bylaw 47/20)
- d) All lands contained within the Municipality with the exception of the area included in the Corman Park – Saskatoon Planning District (Bylaw 48/20).
