5. R.M. of Dundurn – Tamke Road

The R.M. of Dundurn and the R.M. of Corman Park currently have a road maintenance agreement for a 3.3 mile portion of Tamke Road (TWP RD 350) where-as the R.M. of Dundurn is responsible for the maintenance of the right-of-way.

The R.M. of Dundurn has requested to lower the speed limit along a segment of Tamke Road (TWP RD 350) for the last 1/2 mile before RR 3042 (Grid 663), which runs adjacent to a Dundurn area Subdivision. Currently the speed limit for this segment of road is 80 km/h.

The R.M. of Dundurn is speculating a speed limit adjustment of 60km/h for the subject segment and the erection and maintenance of the signage will be assumed by the R.M. of Dundurn as per the current agreement in place; this will be split at a cost of 50% with the R.M. of Corman Park.

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Discussion ensued. Administration to check with Corman Park Police regarding the request for a speed limit adjustment.

6. Traffic Bylaw No. 58/20 Amendments and Overweight Vehicles in Non-Compliance

The current Traffic Bylaw No. 58/20 has been reviewed by Administration and Corman Park Police. Upon review, it has been determined that there were a few roads that were missed being listed in a few of the subdivisions or that had an incorrect road standard assigned to them.

Upon review by Corman Park's Chief of Police, it was noted that there was no provision made for a clear definition of "a person" within the current Bylaw. As a result, the Chief has provided the following recommendation for the amendment of the current Traffic Bylaw No. 58/20:

Currently, our Traffic Bylaw refers to "person" for many sections as being responsible for infractions. "Person" is not defined in the definitions. Where this creates concern for enforcement is that, although there is provision for holding the owner responsible, we refer to "person" without definition and this may not always include owner or registered owner if a Justice of the Peace sees otherwise.

I would like to see "person" defined as "means and includes operator, authorized person, owner or registered owner as ascribed to by The Traffic Safety Act". This definition could follow parking and before road committee under definitions. The idea is to broadly define anyone who could be responsible for the vehicle.

Secondly, under Section 8. (a)(ii) Penalties I would like to see "in the case of a corporation" to include "corporation or owner"

Administration has noted all the suggested amendments including Tamke Road and will bring these forward as Traffic Bylaw No. 40/21 to a future Council meeting.

7. Hodgson Road

Councillor Greenwood brought forward concerns from ratepayers in Division 4 regarding the increased traffic of large trucks hauling to Buck's Auto resulting in the deterioration of the road.


