

**HAMLET OF NEUHORST**  
**ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**  
**DECEMBER 5, 2020**

Corey Wiebe asked about the promise of the #3050 roadway repaved the rest of the way. Shaun assured him that we would look into that and see what the future plans are for the RM to pave the road.

Corey also suggested that council should ask to have a grader pass through the hamlet when there is heavy snowfall – not just a truck with a blade.

Bernice Ruf brought forward the following concerns:

- Having a set date for the AGM – ie: the third Thursday of September, Shaun agreed that we certainly could do something like that.
- Having job descriptions for each board member as well as a community constitution, the job descriptions is something that we will work on once the Covid restrictions have been eased.
- The hall is in need of a new water heater – we will have to discuss the size and type of water heater as well as the cost.
- Bernice would like to see an increase of hall rentals once Covid is under control
- It would be nice to have a gazebo for the park as well as playground development that follows the safety guidelines.
- There is a monument where the Neuhorst School used to be, it would be nice to see it fixed up and taken care of.

Over the course of the afternoon and in having conversations with the residents of the hamlet it was decided to have an evening of hayrides. It was Covid safe and fun. It was held Sunday, December 13 from 6 pm till 9 pm. A big thank you to Mike Bueckert for giving families hayrides.
