

Giants fall short at 15U AA tournament

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The Sask Five Giants Sluggers competed hard during a U15 AA tier 1/2 tournament in Saskatoon, which proved to be challenging.

The tournament was held from June 25 to 27, and other teams that competed in it included the Blue Jay Bruisers, Cardinals, Blue Jays-Gagnon, A's and Braves which are all Saskatoon teams.

Sask Five began the tournament, by dropping a 12-7 decision to the Saskatoon Blue Jays-Gagnon.

Despite the loss, Sask Five jumped to a 2-0 lead. However, the Jays had a big third inning, scoring seven runs to

take the lead.

Sask Five pulled within a couple runs in its half of the inning, but in the later innings, the Giants couldn't overcome the Blue Jays.

The Giants were matched up against the Saskatoon A's for their second game of the tournament, but fell 14-4 to finish in third place of Pool B after the round-robin.


Sask Five battled the Blue Jay Bruisers for its crossover game, and it was also the Giants' third matchup of the day.

The Giants battled hard against the Bruisers but came up short in a 9-5 decision.

Despite not qualifying for the semifinal round the Giants had the opportunity to


play in the consolation final against the Braves, however, the Braves came out on top 15-6.

Rural Municipality of Corman Park

Public notice is hereby given that the Council of the Rural Municipality of Corman Park No. 344 intends to adopt a bylaw under The Planning and Development Act, 2007 to amend Bylaw No. 09/94, known as the R.M. of Corman Park Zoning Bylaw.

INTENT

- a) Proposed Bylaw No. 27/21 will rezone from Agricultural District (AG) to Agricultural Residential 1 District (AR1) the lands described below. Proposed Bylaw No. 27/21 will provide for the creation of two residential parcels, one vacant of development and the other containing an existing yardsite.
- b) Proposed Bylaw No. 30/21 will rezone from Agricultural District (AG) to Agricultural Residential 1 District (AR1) the lands described below. Proposed Bylaw No. 30/21 will provide for the creation of two vacant residential parcels.
- a) Proposed Bylaw No. 31/21 will rezone from Agricultural District (AG) to Agricultural Residential 1 District (AR1) the lands described below. Proposed Bylaw No. 31/21 will provide for rezoning of an existing agricultural residential parcel to align with the current Zoning Bylaw and creation of one vacant residential parcel.
- b) Proposed Bylaw No. 34/21 will provide for textual amendments related to Schedule 'D' – AR3 – Agricultural Residential 3 Zoning District – Blumenheim, including:
 - i. Clarified the overall of the intent of the AR3 District;
 - ii. Addition of "Home Occupation" as a permitted use;
 - iii. Addition of "Agricultural Support Service", "Day Care Service", "Intensive Agricultural Operation – Livestock", and "Equestrian Facility" as discretionary uses;
 - iv. Removal of "Municipal Facility" as a permitted use;
 - v. Allowing for the subdivision of a single severance on specific parcels ranging in size from 1 ha (2.47 acres) to 4.05 ha (10 acres) in size;
 - vi. Revision of the minimum lot frontage requirements from 85 metres (278.9 ft) to 30 metres (114.8 feet);
 - vii. Included consideration for a 300 animal unit Intensive Agricultural Operation – Livestock on Parcel I, Plan 101514721, SE31.39.3;
 - viii. Updating discretionary use criteria specific to the AR3 District;

- ix. Clarifying which properties are eligible for subdivision through an analysis of development standards and display of this information on a community map;
- x. Removal of the reference for keeping of livestock to be consistent with the Keeping of Animals – Bylaw No. 10/15; and
- xi. Other minor housekeeping amendments.

AFFECTED LANDS

- a) The affected lands are all that portion of NE 34-35-6-W3 shown shaded on Map 1 (Bylaw 27/21).
- b) The affected lands are all that portion of NE 8-39-5-W3 shown shaded on Map 2 (Bylaw 30/21).
- c) The affected lands are all that portion of NW 9-35-5-W3 shown shaded on Map 3 (Bylaw 31/21).
- d) The affected lands are all lands within the NE 30-39-3-W3, NE & SE 31-39-3-W3 currently zoned Agricultural Residential 3 Zoning District (AR3), shown shaded on Map 4 (Bylaw 34/21).

PUBLIC INSPECTION

Any person may inspect the proposed Bylaw between 8:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, excluding holidays, up to 5:00 p.m. until Friday, July 9, 2021. The proposed Bylaws are also posted for online viewing at www.rm-cormanpark.ca under Public Notice.


PUBLIC HEARING




MAP 1
