

# Splash park committee gets funding boost

The Delisle Splash Park Committee received a big boost in its fundraising efforts after a substantial donation from Richardson Pioneer Limited for \$50,000.

Richardson Pioneer made the donation during a comedy night fundraiser in Delisle on July 10, which featured Saskatchewan comedian Kelly Taylor.

The funds donated by Richardson Pioneer Limited are being used to build a storage building by the splash park in Harold Worth Park.

The building will house the mechanical needs of the splash pad itself as well as separate storage bays for Delisle Minor Ball and Delisle Minor Soccer.

Harold Worth Park hosts many events and this building will also have an area for collecting tickets for tournaments held at the site. The splash park committee is very excited to have Richardson Pioneer Limited as the major sponsor for the structure.

Proceeds from the comedy night are also going towards

the landscaping of the park were the splash pad is being constructed.

"We are still finalizing the construction costs of the building and foundation, as well as fencing, landscaping and seating areas," said splash park committee chair Deb Winder, via a new release. "Our original quotes were from 2019 when we started applying for grants and these costs have become very volatile through the COVID-19 pandemic."

The splash park committee is thankful for its sponsors because the comedy night couldn't have happened without their support.

"This event could not have happened without local support and we want to thank Ron Brown Implements for his sponsorship of the event," said Winder.

"We would like to pass on thanks to Saskatoon Audio Visual and Starling Septic that both contributed to the event as well.

Construction of the park is expected to be completed this year and the plan is to have it open to the public in spring of 2022.

## Area parks to receive upgrades

Construction of new group pavilions at day-use areas in Pike Lake and Blackstrap Provincial Parks are on the horizon this summer.

The upgrades are among several capital investments amounting to more than \$18.1 million earmarked by

the province for provincial parks this year.

Approximately \$7.7 million is being invested in facility and infrastructure improvements in central and northern provincial parks in 2021-22.

"Our provincial parks con-

tinue to be popular vacation destinations for generations of Saskatchewan families," Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Laura Ross said. "Maintaining and improving our parks has been an ongoing priority for this government. Since 2007, nearly \$141 million has been invested in our park facilities and infrastructure, and planned improvements for 2021-22 will further increase the total investment to nearly \$160 million."

Along with ongoing improvements to washrooms, docks, day-use facilities and signage, upgrades scheduled for completion prior to the 2022 camping season in central and northern Saskatchewan provincial parks include:

- \* New group pavilion developments in day-use areas of Pike Lake and Blackstrap

Provincial Parks;

- \* A campground service centre replacement for The Battlefords Provincial Park and a service centre upgrade in Lac La Ronge Park;

- \* A new boat launch development at Lac La Ronge Provincial Park and refurbishing of the historic Holy Trinity Church near Stanley Mission;
- \* Potable water system improvements for Lac La Ronge, Candle Lake and Meadow Lake Provincial Parks; and

- \* Replacement of park maintenance buildings at Great Blue Heron and Makwa Provincial Parks.

Upgrades that began in 2020-21 and are now complete in central and northern Saskatchewan provincial parks include:

- \* A campground service centre replacement at Pike Lake Provincial Park.

## Rural Municipality of Corman Park

- The affected lands are all that portion of NE 14-35-6-W3 shown shaded on Map 2 (Bylaw 33/21).
- The affected lands are all that portion of NW 20-38-6-W3 shown shaded on Map 3 (Bylaw 36/21).


### PUBLIC INSPECTION
