


Public notice is hereby given that the Council of the Rural Municipality of Corman Park No. 344 intends to adopt a bylaw under The Planning and Development Act, 2007 to amend Bylaw No. 09/94, known as the R.M. of Corman Park Zoning Bylaw.

INTENT

- a) Proposed Bylaw No. 13/22 will rezone from Agricultural District (AG) to Agricultural Residential 1 District (AR1) the lands described below. Proposed Bylaw No. 13/22 will provide for the creation of one undeveloped residential parcel.
- b) Proposed Bylaw No. 14/22 will provide for textual amendments to the R.M. of Corman Park Zoning Bylaw. The amendments are to:
 - a. Section 4, Development Standards, replacing "The Uniform Building and Accessibility Standards Act" with "The Construction Codes Act and Regulations" where it appears; and
 - b. Section 5, Zoning Districts and include:
 - i. revisions to Schedules A-C, to remove redundancy related to single detached one-unit dwellings and correct references to the types of discretionary uses that can have a residence as an accessory use,
 - ii. revisions to Schedules A-E and Schedule G, to remove Secondary Suites as a "discretionary use", as a Secondary Suite is already a "permitted use" in those Zoning Districts;
 - iii. revisions to Schedule E to remove a Mobile Home to be utilized as a temporary residence during construction of a permanent dwelling as a "discretionary use", as Temporary Construction Dwellings have been introduced as Section 4.29 and removes redundancy in the CR1 Zoning District;
 - iv. revisions to Schedules E and G to remove the placement of a sea or rail container as a "Discretionary Use"; as a Shipping Container can be permitted accessory use as per Section 4.23

AFFECTED LANDS

- a) The affected lands are all that portion of SW 27-35-4-W3 shown shaded on Map 1 (Bylaw No. 13/22).
- b) The affected lands are all lands contained within the Municipality with the exception of the area included in the Saskatoon North Partnership for Growth (P4G) Planning District (Bylaw No. 14/22)

PUBLIC INSPECTION

Any person may inspect a proposed Bylaw between 8:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, excluding holidays, up to 5:00 p.m. until Friday June 17, 2022. The proposed Bylaws are also posted for online viewing at www.rmormanpark.ca under Public Notice.

PUBLIC HEARING

Council will hold a public hearing on Monday, June 20, 2022 at 11:00 a.m. to hear any person or group that wants to comment on a proposed Bylaw. The R.M. Council meeting and public hearing will be held via remote GoToMeeting, which is open to the public via computer, tablet, device or over the phone. All written comments received by 5:00 p.m., Monday, June 13, 2022 will be forwarded to Council. Information on how to enter the remote Council GoToMeeting online or via phone can be found on the R.M. website, and will be included in the published Agenda Package no later than the Thursday preceding the meeting.
